

Four Spaniards Fall in the First Fight of the Invasion.

#### AMERICANS ESCAPE UNHURT



United States military expedition, under
the command of Major Gen. Nelson A.
Miles, which left Guantanamo Bay during
the evening of Thurnday last, was landed
here successfully to-day, after a skirmish
here successfully to-day. with a deinchment of the Spanish troops and a crew of thirty belonging to the launch of the United States auxiliary gunboat

Four of the Spaniards were killed, but no Americans were hurt.

The American troops will be pushed forward promptly, in order to capture the rail-road leading to Ponce, which is only about ten miles east of this place. From Ponce there is on excellent military read, running eighty-five unites north to San Juan de Puerto Rico, the capital of the island. The ships left Guantanamo Ray Thursday

Guantes is a town of 1,000 inhabitants on the southern coast of the island. On a rough calculation, it is less than twenty miles in an air line distant from Ponce, and sixty-five miles from San Juan, against which the assault is to be directed. Guantea is about six miles south of Yanco, of which city it forms the port, and with which it is connected by a good road.

The town is situated on a bay of the same name, which forms one of the best ports in the whole island. The banks to the right are steep and form a good natural wharf. Three vessels can lie slongside and unload by means of gang planks. Vessels of thirty feet draught can enter the bay casely, and proceed close in shore. The conspicuous advantage of this port, aside from its excellent harbor facilities for the transports, is the absence of fortifications

#### Fine Read for the Advance

While the distance from Ponce to San Juan is much greater than from the point originally selected for Miles's landing, there is, according to the military information charts, a splendid fourteen-foot mac-administed road leading directly across the administed road leading directly across the island to flan Juan, on the north shore. 















### Crecimiento real del PNB en Puerto Rico Año Fiscal: 2006 - 2021





### **PUERTO RICO'S PUBLIC DEBT**





















### Total Population of Puerto Rico (2010-2024)









